

Homework

Children in Year 2 will continue to receive weekly homework. It will be sent home on a Friday and we ask that it is completed and returned no later than Wednesday.

Each week your child will receive:

- A piece of English Homework
 - A piece of Maths Homework
 - A list of spellings (tested fortnightly, to ensure that children are constantly applying their knowledge from previous weeks)
 - A reading book appropriate to your child's reading ability – to be changed twice per week. (As well as word recognition, a key focus on home reading should also be comprehension.)
- If you listen to your child read, could you please question them about what they've read to build up their comprehension skills? They will complete tests in Reading (in addition to Maths and Spelling, punctuation and grammar) towards the end of the school year. A meeting will be held on **26th February** regarding these SAT tests.

Please ensure that reading records and reading books are brought into school every day and you read with your child at home as often as possible.

Thank you for the continued support you give us with homework and reading.

PE - Swimming lessons for Class 6 will stop on Tuesday 12th February. In replace of swimming children will complete an additional hour of PE weekly. Their PE lessons will be led by Myles from Craig's coaching.

Please ensure that PE kits are kept in school. They will be sent home at the end of every half term and term. Please ensure that all of your child's belongings are labelled with their name.

Useful resources to support your child at home

This will help the children develop reading fluency and comprehension skills. Log in's for Bug Club can be found on the first page of reading journals.

Joined handwriting

Children in Class 6 are continuing to learn how to join their writing and many of them now use joined writing in all of their school work.

Children will only be able to use joined writing in all of their work if their spelling is mostly accurate.

If your child is still struggling to spell words on the list of common exception words I provided last term, could you please practice with them at home? Spare copies are available from me if you need one.

Please can you make sure all of your child's belongings are clearly labelled and that children bring a water bottle to school each day? There are still some coats and jumpers without names in and a few items have gone missing. Some items, which do have names in, have also gone missing so could you please double check the uniform your child brings home?
